



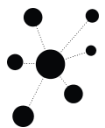

What is EUSALP?

A macroregional strategy strives to find common solutions for common challenges in a defined area. It is a strategic approach at transnational level.

Turn the 3 No's of the EU-Commission into opportunities:

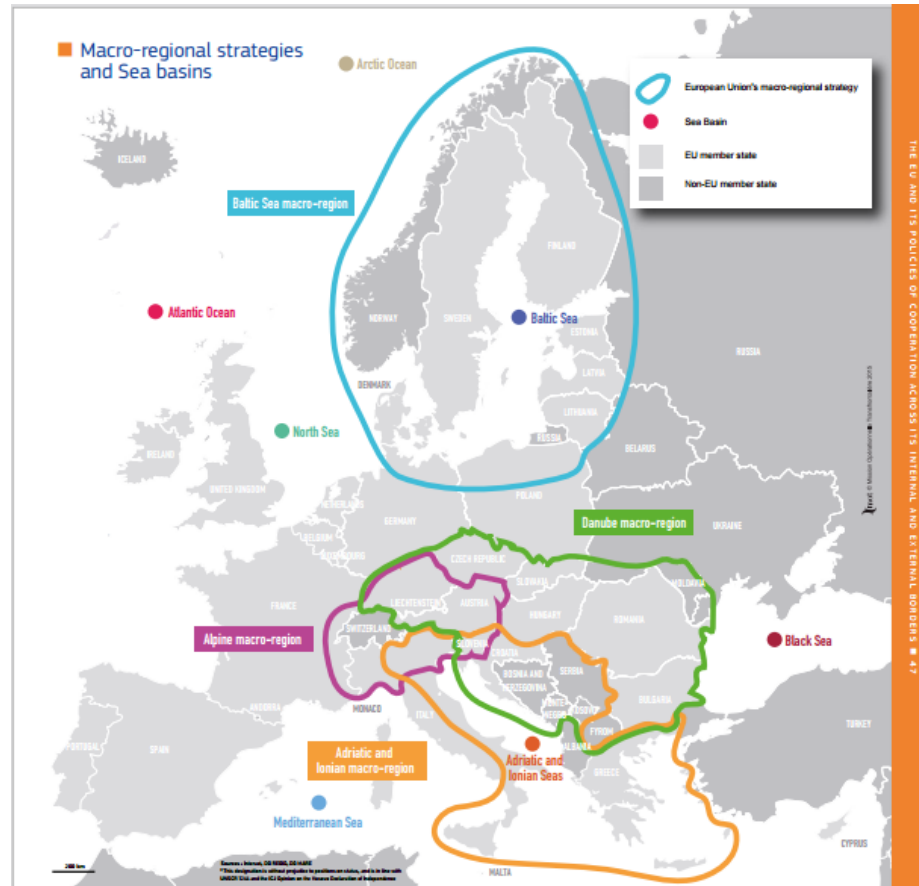
- No new structures -> better cooperation in a multilevel-governance approach.
- No new legislation -> better alignment of existing policies.
- No new funding -> better coordination of existing fundings

A bit of history:

- Initiated by impetus from the alpine regions starting from 2011 («bottom up»).
 - Elaboration of an action plan and adoption of this action plan in 2015.
 - Start of implementation based on the action plan in 2016. Rotating presidencies: SLO (2016), BAY (2017), Tyrol (2018), RLO (2019), FR (2020-21), ...

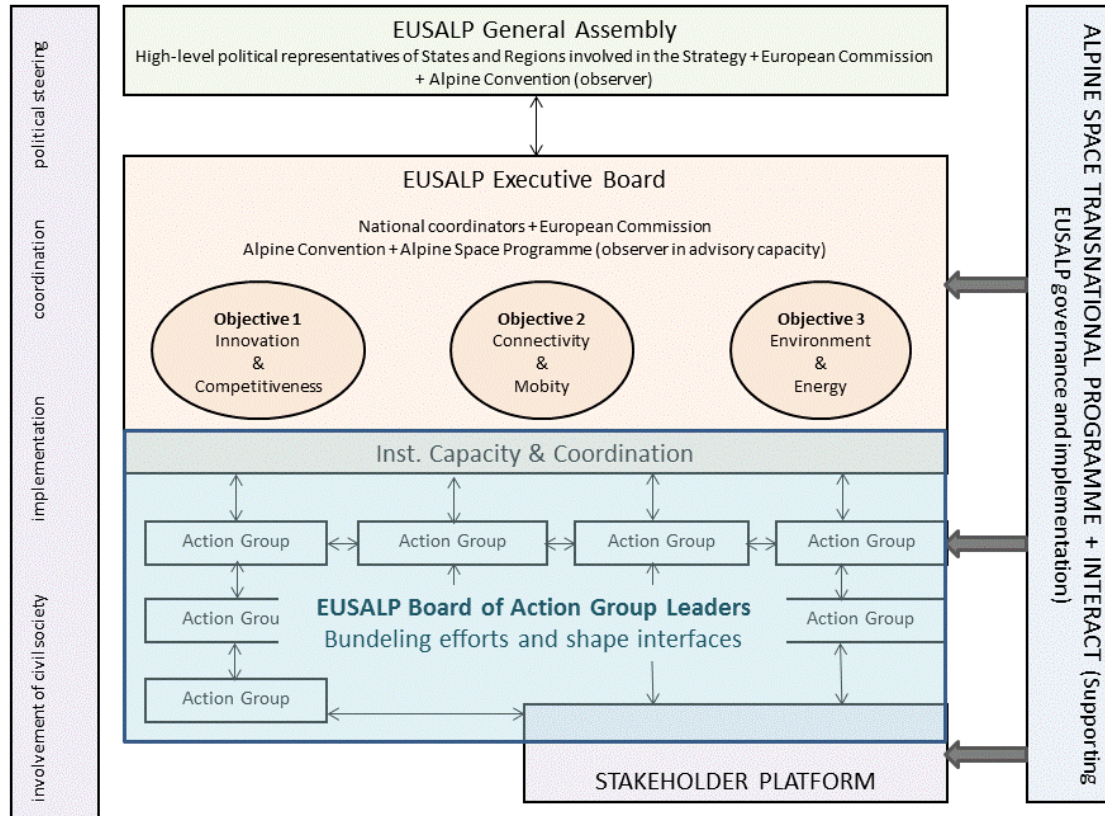

EUSALP is strongly supported by the Alpine Space Program

- **AlpGov 1: 2016 – 2019**
Focus: Capacity building of AG's, Implementation of strategic implementation initiatives (at least 1 per AG), enhancing governance and financial mechanisms, encouraging cross-AG-cooperation through ARPAF-Funds.
-> **Build-up-phase, mostly in a (sectoral) project logic.**
- **AlpGov 2: 2020 - 2022**
Focus: Capitalisation, Cross-sectoral strategic implementation initiatives, entering into the policy cycle, building up a learning environment.
-> **More strategic approach, consolidation, more work across AG's, focus on policy and embedding.**

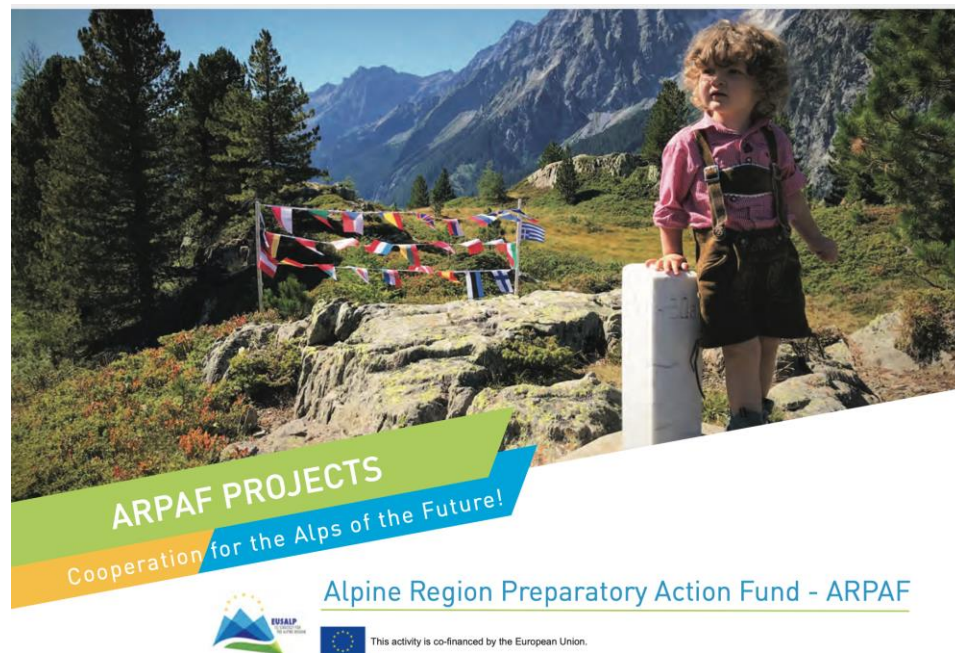
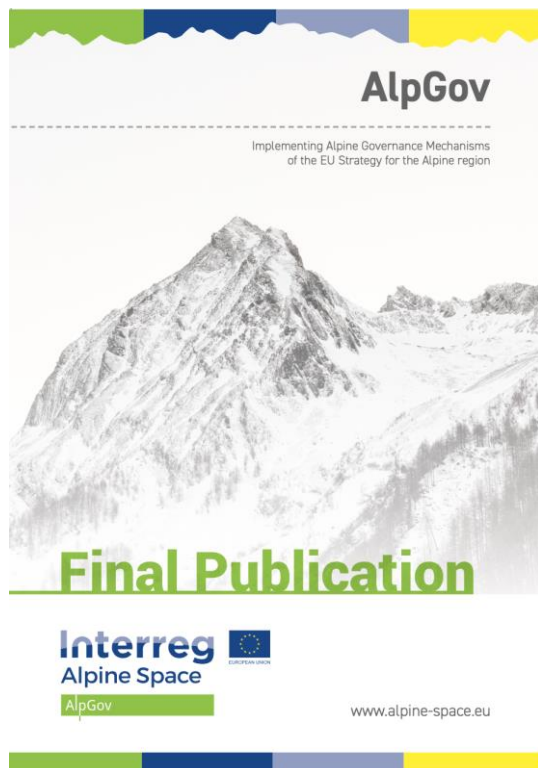
Smart villages – a strategic implementation initiative of AG5

 - **Smart villages (Alpine Space Program project, 2018 – 21)**
 - Fibre optics backbone in the alpine area (study carried out in 2018-19)
 - Crossborder Mobility (ARPAF project 2017 – 18)
 - Smart SME's (ARPAF project 2019 – 21)
 - Think Tank on SGI (since 2016)

 6. Implementing modal shift policies with a focus on toll systems (AG4)
 7. **Smart villages (AG5)**
 8. Improving (digital) crossborder connectivity (AG5)
 9. Knowledge network for agri-food and forestry value chains (AG6)
 10. Sustainable land use and soil protection (AG6)
 11. Linking urban and inner alpine green infrastructure (AG7)
 12. Fostering the natural risk governance dialogue (AG8)
 13. Increasing energy efficiency in the enterprises (AG9)

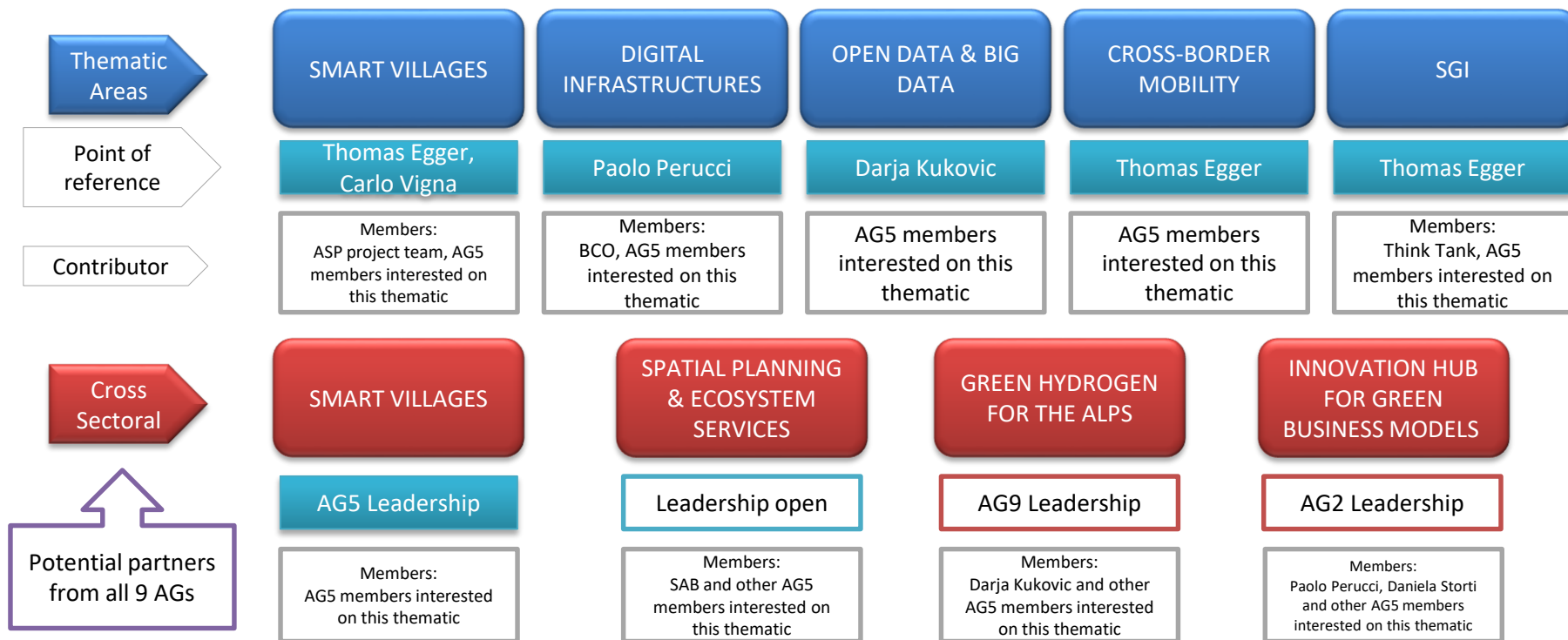
AlpGov 2 – Cross-sectoral Strat. Impl. initiatives

- Spatial planning (to elaborate a common spatial development perspective)
- A carbon neutral alpine region (focus on green hydrogen)
- Innovation Hub for Green Business (Wood and timber value chains, sustainable tourism, green and digital industry)
- **Smart villages (to transform as many as possible alpine villages into Smart villages and to create a network of them)**
- EUSALP Innovation Facility (supportive tool)
- + at least 1 strategic implementation initiative per AG

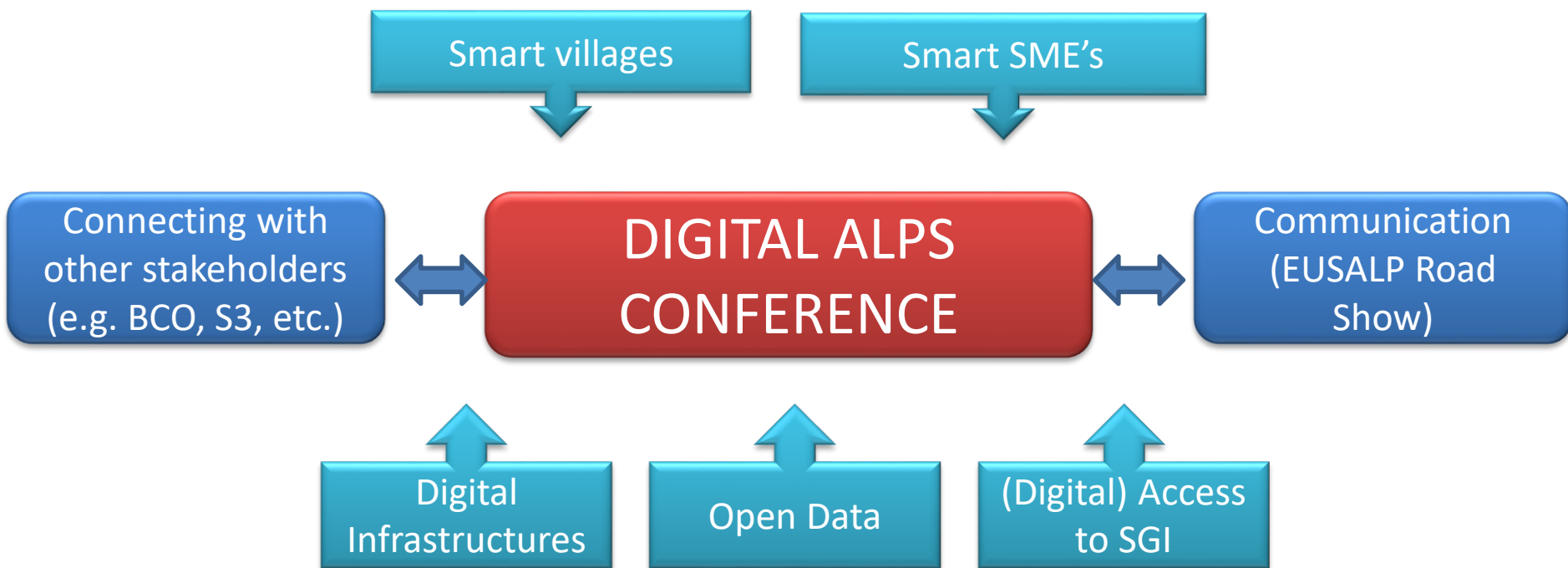
AlpGov 2 – organization of AG5 in focus areas

Smart villages – a strategic priority for EUSALP

- The Smart villages project (2018 – 21) was important to make the Smart villages approach known and to develop a common understanding, methodology and transferable tools (DEP) and to test them in practise. The Covid-19-crisis proofed, that the Smart villages approach helps to strenghten the resilience of mountain villages.
- The Smart villages project has to a great extent contributed to the profile of EUSALP and to its visibility.

Smart villages – a strategic priority for EUSALP

- In the period 2020 – 22, Smart villages is a strategic priority for EUSALP. The focus lies on capitalisation of the experiences from the ASP-Smart villages project. The aim is to turn as many as possible mountain villages into Smart villages. Foreseen activities are:
 - Survey on existing Smart villages in the Alpine area (✓)
 - Survey on existing financial support mechanisms for Smart villages (✓)
 - Promoting the Smart villages approach in the whole alpine area
 - > Flyer, mainly based on the ASP-project, to be disseminated in 2021.
 - Creating a network of Smart villages in the alpine area to encourage the exchange of experiences
 - Launch of the new network planned for the Digital Alps Conference on 27/28 May 2021 in Trieste.

Specific for CH – Launch of new initiative to develop Smart villages

- Agreement between the State Secretariat for Economic Affairs SECO and SAB
- Support for mountain villages to become Smart villages:
 - Use of the Smartness Self Assessment Tool and the DEP of the ASP Smart villages project.
 - Financial support for villages or regions to elaborate an action plan in a participatory process, involving all relevant stakeholders.
 - Obligation to take part in a national exchange meeting in 2022.
 - Follow-up measures (implementation) to be financed by other, existing instruments.
